



Certificate of Theology

BIBL --150 Survey of Old Testament

This course is an introduction to the study of the development of the central themes, general contents, purpose, and historical setting of the Old Testament. Upon completion of this course, the students should be able to understand an overview of the Old Testament books by noting themes and the emphasis found in each of them; demonstrate an understanding of major themes such as the creation, image of God, sin covenant, law, the land and kinship. Students should also demonstrate an understanding of God's Plan for man unfolding in the Old Testament; and understand the historical, philosophical, and cultural context of the Old Testament.

BIBL – 151 Survey of New Testament

This course is a survey of the history, literature, and contents of the New Testament, with an emphasis on the historical background of the New Testament and the influence of the literature on Western culture. Upon completion of this course, the students should be able to identify the various books of the New Testament and their identifying Characteristics. Students should also be able to demonstrate an understanding of the chronology of New Testament writings and events; the Life of Christ, His humanity, Divinity, and the impact to the Human Race; as well as come to understand the historical, philosophical, and cultural context of the New Testament.

THEO—101 Basic Theology I

This course is a systematic guide to understanding Biblical Truth. It is a theological interpretation of Christian Faith. Upon completion of this course, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of various theological definitions. Students should also be able to demonstrate an understanding of the Trinity of God, the Preincarnate Christ, Christ the Prophet, Priest, and King. Students should be able to exhibit an understanding of ministering spirits, unclean spirits, the creation of man, the fall of man, and the adversary...the Devil.

THEO—201 Basic Theology II

This course is a systematic guide to understanding Biblical Truth, and a theological interpretation of Christian Faith. Upon completion of this course, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of Soteriology, the doctrine of Salvation and how it relates to mankind. Students should also be able to exhibit an understanding of the Dispensational work of the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Godhead; the importance of the Church and its origin; the revelation of the Church to Jesus Christ; an understanding of Eschatology, the last things; and the doctrinal characteristics of Amillennialism, Premillennialism, Millennialism, and Postmillennialism.
